Probably C17 expanded mid-C19. Two storeys thatched. Lower to left hand side. Painted rubble. Brick dressings and quoins to right. Two brick chimneys. Two windows on first floor, 2 on ground floor, 2 light casements, and a C20 square bay to right. To rear on right (west side) a timber corner post of older building retained.

Three bay nave with C13 north aisle little altered. South porch added C19. Lower 2 bay early English chancel and short 3 stage crenellated Perpendicular tower. The windows of the chancel of north aisle are early English and decorated, the rest Perpendicular - 2 windows on south side and the north-west window have Decorated tracery of 2 lights and cusped trefoil. East window a restored geometrical window of 3 lights but improbable tracery. Small pointed priest's door to south.

East wall of former south aisle (assuming there was one) has culus and small foiled window above level of chancel eaves. Vestry to north.

All this heavily restored 1880s by C.E. Ponting.

Interior: north-west window has foiled rear arch. North wall has 2 segment pointed tomb recesses with foiled inner orders and bell caps; slabs with cross and heart said to mark graves of 2 Abbesses of Shaftesbury (who presented to the prebendal living here).

Circa 1200 Norman font-bowl has bead and zig-zag dressings to rim. Wooden screen, C19 in Perpendicular style. Nave roof has cusped braces to collars and cusped windbraces, see also in porch - restoration.

Lychgate with stone tile roof as war memorial.

Probably late C15. Square base with spur chamfered corners. Short shaft with pyramidal stop chamfers.

Mid C19 alterations to probably late C17 house standing on site of earlier one. Two storeys attic and cellar. Chalk rubble with brick dressings. Hipped pantile roof and large brick chimney of irregular plan off centre left. Late C19 gabled projection in Cotswold stone facing to rubble on right hand side. Two gabled dormers. Two ranges of windows on ground floor with segmental heads, to left a tripartite glazing bar sash, to right 4 light casement. Large and tiled gabled porch axial with church, plank door, lintel over has chamfer with ball decoration and sarcen stone jambs. Rear has a 3 light ovolo mullion window retaining an old casement possibly circa 1700. Altered. Interior: inglenook fireplace. First floor has a fireplace with cast iron reeded sides and cast splinx grate head; steep grate said to come from a house lived in by I.K. Brunel. Also on first floor, fragment of the beam from earlier roof.

1824. Modernised. Two storeys rendered rough-cast brick. Band over ground floor. Hipped slate roof. South-east front has 3 windows, entrance front 2, glazing bar sashes in raised surrounds. Modern porch with lobby. Lower 2 window wing to north-west. Two storey bow to rear.

C17 origins. Early-mid C18, altered mid C19. Two and a half storeys rubble with chalk. Tiled roof, hipped to left on cogged brick eaves cornice. Gable end chimney to left rear wall has off-centre chimney. Two gabled dormers. Three first floor windows, casements, outer tripartite, with wooden lintels. On ground floor: angled bay to left and glazing bar sash with brick dressings to the right. Central 6 flush panel door (upper 2 glazed) and tented porch with trellis posts. Modern extension to rear.

Probably early C19. Circa 1813-14. Rounded and painted front. Top battered. Inscription obscured. Painted legend reads: "Swindon 3 miles, Hungerford 13 miles".

Mid-C17 small manor house, restored C19. Two storeys attic and cellar. Rubble with stone tile roof. Diagonal shafts in modern brick to chimneys. South front has 3 gables. Windows mullioned, 3 light in attic, 4 light on first floor, 5 light on ground floor, with chambered mullions

and horizontal drips. Cross mullion window to right and above door which is off-centre left with C19 ashlar porch. Two gables to west with off-set and less regular fenestration, probably originally hollow chamfer mullion and transom windows. Ground floor right hand window a very tall 5-light mullion and transom. Small 2-light cellar windows.

Interior: 2 wide early-mid C17 Tudor arch fireplaces with moulded surrounds, latter have urn-stops and panelled spandrels. Mid-C19 gallery staircase with first floor landing arcade.

Mid C19 brick. Long hipped thatched range with 11, formerly 12, segment headed doors and 5 pairs plus one window. Lean-to to right with 2 light mullion windows to north. Tie rods in shape of horse shoes. South-east and north-east corners rounded.

C18 thatched cottage. Altered. One and a half storeys painted rubble. Half hipped roof with one brick chimney. One dormer cut into thatch. Modern fenestration, on ground floor 3 windows and 2 doors, right hand door linked by lean-to to central bay. Modern extensions to left and right. Included for group value.

C18 thatched cottage. One and a half storeys pebble dash. Half hipped to left. One eyebrow. Two ground floor windows (one an angled bay). Catslide to rear. Mid C19 2 storey extension in painted brick (formerly a separate dwelling) to right with gabled porch to left; 2 windows on first floor, an angled bay on ground floor and double garage doors to right hand. Slate roof with 2 brick chimneys.

C18. Thatched former row. One and a half storeys painted rubble with some brick dressings and mostly timber lintels. Two ridge chimneys, one modern stone, No 24 brick. Three dormers each cut into thatch. Doors with porches, April Cottage porch thatched.

A 3-light mid-C19 segmental headed casement. April Cottage a 3 and a 2-light casement as well as a blocked doorway on ground floor. Gabled extensions to rear.

Dated 1827. Two storey thatched cottage. Coursed and dressed rubble with brick quoins and dressings. Painted. Hipped roof with central brick chimney. Three windows on first floor, 2 on ground floor, latter segment headed, 2 light casements. Two segment-headed doorways, left hand one with thatched porch. Modern lean-to to left. Central first floor datestone 18
