Timber-framed weather-boarded service extension to right hand with door.

Central 6 panel door with wide pedimented doorpiece, fluted pilasters and open pediment into which breaks a segmental radiating and wreathed fanlight. Side lights. Lower 2 storey staff wing to right, 3 windows on 1st floor, 2 on ground floor, moulded eaves cornice with brackets flanking windows. Two storey later wing at an angle to left. To rear centre part has ashlar band over ground floor, ashlar coping and a rounded corner to right. Low stone boundary wall to road.

Modern porch extension to right hand gable. Two storey arched opening to left with water wheel. Tall tapering brick chimney to right at back. Four mill stouts, 2 in front, 2 to right hand gable. Gabled set back converted wing to left.

Projecting Tuscan porch with blocking course to right of centre, ½ glazed door. Modern door to left with intersecting glazing in fanlight; port-hole window to left. Oriel window on gable end of North wing. Five windows to West and 5 to South, latter with pedimented doorcase.

Datestone 1727 but altered considerably in early and mid C19 and recently. Garden front: 2½ storeys pebbledash over brick. Stone tile roof. Brick chimneys, 1 grooved. Band over ground floor. Three bays, outer gabled (to right hand gable is datestone "TS.1727"; Thomas Saddler was vicar 1716-55). In centre wide 3 light angled bay. The windows glazing bar sashes. Door half-glazed to right, reeded lower panels and lean-to slated porch with moulded wood trellis work and scallop eaves; trellis extended to form porch entrance from the street. Extension to South. Road (North) front has remains of moulded wooden eaves board and later C18 brickwork. To West: ashlar dressings to rubble front. Two storeys and blocking course, left hand part has band over ground floor. Two storey angled bay to left, 2 window range to right, brick infill with oriel. Rubble gable end with external stone chimney.

C15 West Tower; C14 aisled and clerestoried 3 bay nave with South porch; 3 bay C14 chancel with North chapel and 2 bay C19 vestry. Restored by T.H. Wyatt 1846, again 1852, 1880s and 1905. Little except the North and South doors and possibly the bases of the arcades survive of the Norman church. Built of rubble. Lead roofs. Cornices and parapets with corbel heads and finials. Apex over chancel arch has restored sacring belfry. Most windows in Decorated style, East window of 5 lights with almond-shaped upper tracery. Clerestory windows square headed with foiled lights. South door: late C12 with horizontal zig-zag order and saltire crosses to label, foliate caps to slender nook shafts. North door: circa 1200 pointed doorway with scalloped caps. Three stage embattled tower with corner pinnacles (added 1846), set off stages, diagonal buttresses to ground and 1st stages. Upper stage possibly added, 2 light traceried windows to belfry. Interior: double chamfered pointed arcades with dying mouldings, North arcade dates from 1846 and probably replaces a Norman one. Late C14/early C15 roof to nave: moulded principal timbers to low pitched panelled roof, arched upper purlins; arcaded trusses with braces from carved head corbels. C19 windbrace roof with hammerbeam corbels in chancel. Arcaded mediaeval reredos in South aisle. Fine sedilia with crocketed ogee arches and carved piscina, both probably C14. Fine chancel memorials to Benets and Buttons and, in C18, to Codringtons; epitaph to William Sadler, early C17, mentioning the Armada. Large iron bound parish chest in nave. The churchyard is well stocked with C17 and C18 headstones, including a triple one on North side. A number of chest tombs to South, several shrouded by immense yew tree outside South porch.

Central glazed door on ground floor approached by steps. Outer ground floor windows tripartite with reeded pilasters and segmental recesses over. Band course at floor level and pilasters to sides. Four window south elevation. Six window east elevation with set back outer windows and arcade of arched recesses on ground floor.
Three and two storey staff wing to north built of gault brick.
High stone wall to garden, gault brick on south side with brick gate piers.
Interior: top-lit staircase, cast iron balusters, oval turret light. Gothick style plaster cornice in ground floor bow-window room.

Two hipped dormers. Chamfered string over ground floor, 3 windows, left hand bay of 3 lights, others 2 light, mullioned. Central doorway with scalloped hood and an extremely fine polished hardwood 21 panel door (see also at Burderop Park, under

Chiseldon). On each side, projecting mid C19 brick and stone tile flanking wings with excellent multi-panel central doors, flanking tripartite windows and venetian windows in gable ends, left hand wing blind. Closing wall to front: C18 brick with moulded coping and, imported, pineapple finials to gate piers.

West front: early C19 added pavilion with much C20 reworking. Two and a half storeys. Moulded plinth and string, latter raised over ground floor windows. Three windows, glazing bar sashes, outer tripartite (with keys on ground floor). Central half glazed door with reeded pilasters and radiating and patterned fanlight. Very large chimney stack to rear. Side windows on south return are C20 mullioned type. Carriage-sweep with 2 pairs of C18 style rusticated ashlar piers with moulded capping and ball finials.

South front links east and west parts of house and has a number of circa 1700 mullion windows, mostly ovolo.

Interior: 2 staircases, one late C17 with heavy balusters on both sides and flat baluster gates at base. Three door surrounds in east part have enriched stop chamfers. One ground floor room to south has restored C17 panelling in it. In the west part the north room has a mid C19 Gothic marble fireplace.

Red brick in Flemish bond, but rubble to back wall, and some chalk block to inner face; plain tile roof. Plain symmetrical front block with wing to back right of late C19 date, not of special interest. Two storeys and attic, 3 windows, 3 light casements to low elliptical arches at ground floor and straight brick arches at first floor; window above door is 2-light. All have small flush ashlar keystone. Central 6-panel door, upper two panels glazed in C19 gabled porch on posts and with decorative barge boards. Back has two 3-light raking dormers. original rear door, a heavy 6 panel fielded one now within building, but opposite front entry. Brick gable stack to right. Interior has some panelled shutters and good C18 panelled doors at ground floor. C19 plank and batten doors to first floor. Roof is A-frame with two butt-purlins, could be of late C17 date corresponding with date-stone: members are rough, and limewashed, suggesting that this might have been ancillary to the main mill building. Ground floor has chamfered beams to run-out stops. Externally the building looks like a late C18 or early C19 structure, but it may be a substantial cladding or re-build of an earlier one.

All these to stone splayed lintels over-running the openings. Off centre right plank door under cantilevered gabled hood; 3 stone steps approach. Back has three 2-light casements with lintels as front, at first floor level; ground floor has two modified openings and formerly arched entry for overshot wheel. Gable brick stacks; half-hip to left. Interior has 5 bay heavy Queen posts off main floor beams, and principals tied back to posts from plate level c1m above upper floor. 4 heavy transverse floor beams at each level. One pulley wheel at ridge. In wall adjoining Mill House a date stone IL (possibly John Little) 1685: this probably refers to the adjoining property. In a ground floor fireplace a fireback in cast iron dated 1588 (?), with two naive trees, and two anchors with rope coits, in 3 panels surrounded by and separated by cable mould: this said to have been brought from elsewhere. To left is brick and tile stable block

with loft opening over 9 pane casement and door; connected to main building by one storey link. Some chalk block within. At back of mill remains of stone wall to east.
