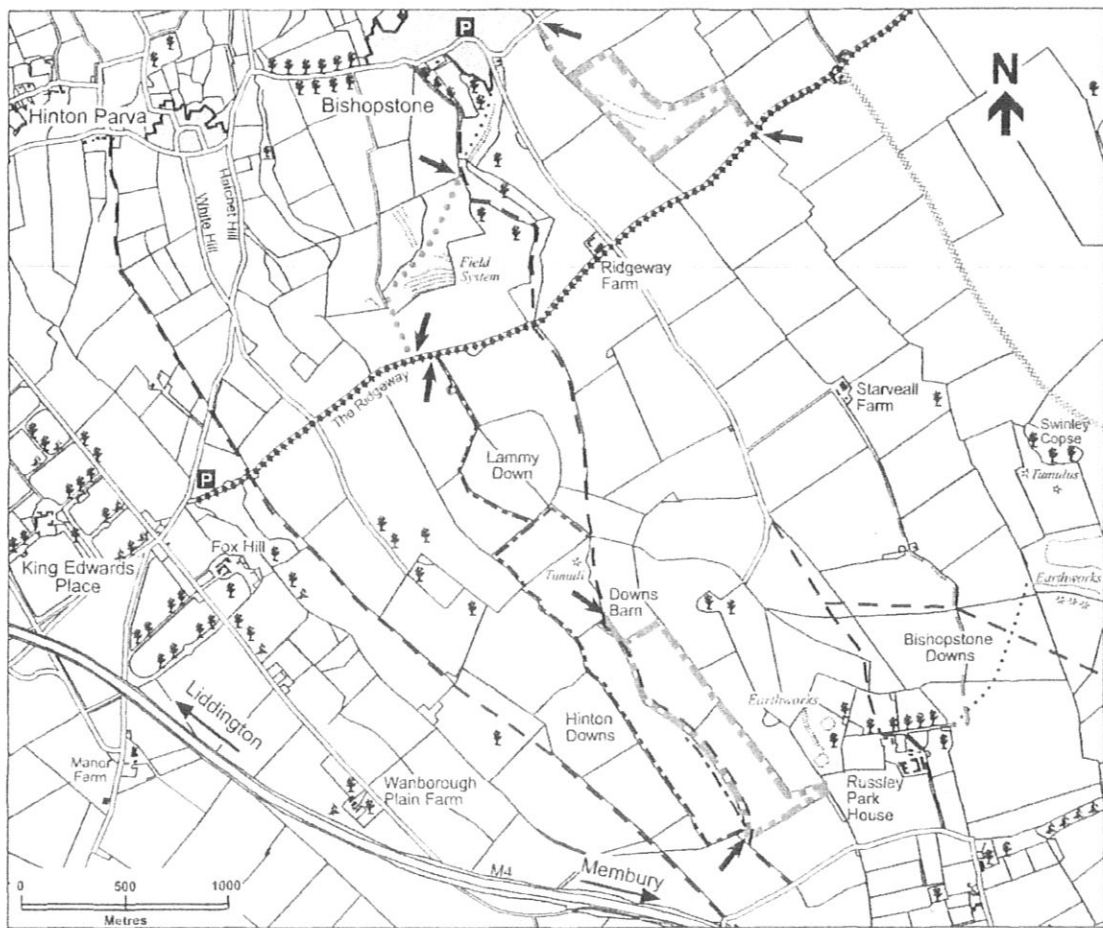

# CONSERVATION WALKS

A permissive footpath which provides an extra link between Bishopstone and the Ridgeway National Trail, enabling you to complete a circular walk. Here, you can appreciate a magnificent view over a well-preserved field system dating from medieval or earlier times. This was thought to have been produced by ploughing to grow crops on the hillside. The other access sites of Eastbrook Valley and Lammy Down are easily accessible from here.
