The below contains the Swindon Borough Council response to an examiner question which was received 16 January 2020. The enquiry was as follows,

1. Basic Conditions Statement

In order to meet the basic conditions, the NP should demonstrate how it contributes to the achievement of sustainable development. However, I see no reference to this in the Basic Conditions Statement. Please can you assist?

Table 2 sets put an assessment of how the Neighbourhood Plan conforms with the Adopted Swindon Borough Local Plan 2026 and the Minerals and Waste Core Strategies. However, the review of the Swindon Borough Local Plan is now well under way and is currently at the Submission Draft consultation stage. Has there been any assessment of the Neighbourhood Plan against the emerging policies of the new Local Plan?

The below table sets out the assessment of the Neighbourhood Plan against the emerging policies of the new Local Plan. The current Local Plan for the Borough of Swindon for the period to 2036 is under Review. Swindon Borough Council has published the Regulation 19 Proposed Submission Draft Version of the local plan for public representations. The public consultation closed 31 January 2020.
