Independent Travel Team: What do they do?

Roger, Independent Travel Team Leader, SEND Travel



I'm Roger, Independent Travel Hub Team Leader.

I've been involved with SEND Transport in Swindon for many years, and took up this new post recently as part of a restructure. This is a new venture for Swindon, but one that is successfully established in a lot of other local authorities around the country, and we have recently been gathering best practice from several of these authorities.

The work of my team is about improving life chances for many of our CYP who have EHCPs, by identifying and training them to travel independently between home and their educational setting. Independent Travel Training is 1 to 1 training to undertake pre-planned routes, either by walking, by public transport, or a mixture of both.

Demand for travel assistance for eligible CYP has been growing year on year for a very long time, and this is not something that is unique to Swindon.

As local authorities face ongoing financial challenges, strategic initiatives such as ITT can help to ease this pressure, by suppressing demand for spaces on contract transport such as taxis and minibuses.

The staff complement of the ITT Hub is as follows:

- 1 x Team Leader
- 2 x Travel Coordinators
- 2 x Travel Assistants

To date, the Team Leader and 1 x Travel Assistant posts are filled, and we are recruiting for the 3 other posts.

SEND SURVEY 2022



Between October and December 2022, the fourth annual SEND Survey was circulated out to parents/carers, practitioners and young people in Swindon. The aim of the survey is to understand a range of opinions and experiences of SEND Services in Swindon in order to improve the services available. Thank you very much to everyone who responded to the survey and for taking the time to provide feedback to us.

Here is a summary of some of the main findings from the survey:

Who responded?



Views of young people

67% of young people were 'Happy' or 'Very happy' with Swindon SEND Services this year, and **52%** felt that they were involved in decisions about their life 'Always' or 'Most of the time'. **62%** of young people said they felt 'Positive' or 'Very positive' about the future for themselves.

Young people shared that SEND Services could be better for them if there were more clubs, volunteering or work experience opportunities for them. They also told us that we could better include them in decisions about their life by discussion options with them and giving them more information and time to understand it and to always rely or listen to their parents.

Views of parents

Overall, **32%** of parents/carers were 'Satisfied' or 'Very satisfied' with Swindon SEND services. **56%** of parents/carers felt 'Satisfied' or 'Very satisfied' that their child's education setting meets their needs.

Parents/carers identified that the things that had worked well for their child over the past 12 months were:

- School support
- Therapy (e.g. SALT, OT, Physio)
- Aiming High
- Parental support

- Mental health support
- EHCPs

Parents/carers feel that Swindon's SEND Services could be better if waiting times for services was shorter, there were more services available and if services listened to parents.

Whilst there are some aspects of Swindon's SEND Service that are working for young people and parents, there is room for improvement to ensure that all families are satisfied with the service they receive and that young people are getting the right support at the right time.
