

GOOD PRACTICE EXAMPLE FROM SBC EARLY YEARS TEAM: EARLY YEARS LEVEL 3 SENCO QUALIFICATION

WHAT ARE WE MAKING BETTER?

We are upskilling SENCos in Early Years settings (PVI and maintained nurseries). This will increase their confidence, knowledge and skills in identifying emerging Special Needs and supporting children to make the best possible progress.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

We are offering access to an online learning platform with materials and activities which support SENCo's learning. The learning reflections and activities are assessed by Eastern Partnership and learners will achieve a L3 certificate in SEND once the activities have been successfully completed.

To add value to the course, and ensure that SENCo's are able to see their learning in a local context, we are offering 5 "face to face" (although delivered virtually for the first cohort) days of training. During these we link the online materials to the policy and process in Swindon. We also have guest speakers from Health Visiting, SALT, Swindon SEND Families Voice, Portage, Special Tots/Koalas, SENDIASS, Educational Psychology, SEMH team, Swindon Autism Support Service, Visual and hearing Support services, Occupational Therapy and TaMHs.

This multi agency approach will ensure that SENCos are aware of the support available for Swindon children and how to access it as well as enabling professionals to share key messages bout good practice with SENCos.

EY SENCos will be confident in identifying emerging SEN at the first possible opportunity. They will be familiar with best practice in supporting children with SEN and will know how they can access support from other agencies when it is appropriate.

Children will be supported effectively. Any additional needs will be identified early and support will be in place at the earliest possible opportunity so that they are able to make the best possible progress.
